Mollie's father, William Crooks Baldwin (WCB), left a will of sorts: a recital of what he'd already given his children who had lived to adulthood. It was written in 25 May 1883, six years before his death, and, as the note at the bottom of the second page says, found, unwitnessed, at the home of Charles and [Cyrena] Maud (Baldwin) McCrossen; Maud was the daughter of WCB's son Thomas Hampton and Nellie Maranda (Evans) Baldwin (see BEB I,1,7; VI,1,7-8; and XI,2,7-8)

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I William C Baldwin of the county of
